Everything You Need to Know About Enrolling Your Child in Preschool

THE IMPORTANCE OF PRESCHOOL

Ninety percent of a child's brain develops in the first five years of life. By attending a high-quality preschool program, your child is preparing for kindergarten and beyond. Children learn important social skills, such as taking turns, being respectful, and problem solving. They also learn important pre-reading and pre-math skills, such as vocabulary development, an awareness of sounds and letters, patterns, and shapes.

WHAT IS THE MUSCATINE PRESCHOOL ALLIANCE (MPA)?

- A partnership between district and community preschools.
- **Tuition-free classes for 4-year-olds**. (Your child must be 4 by September 15).
- Funding is provided through the Iowa Statewide Voluntary Preschool Program (SWVPP). Some programs may have a one-time registration fee.
- Each 4-year-old program offers a quality education that:
 - » is accredited through the Iowa Quality Preschool Program Standards (IQPPS) or the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC).
 - » uses a research-based curriculum that aligns with the lowa Early Learning Standards.
 - » has a state-certified early childhood teacher.
- 3-year-old programming is available at most sites.
- » 3-year-old programming is not currently state-funded so a monthly tuition may be charged; however, scholarship opportunities are readily available through Early Childhood Iowa. Please ask about these opportunities when registering your child.

WHEN SHOULD I REGISTER MY CHILD FOR PRESCHOOL?

- You can register your child any time after the first of the year (January) for the following school year.
- Register early to ensure a spot for your child programs fill up quickly!
- For district programs, please contact the Early Childhood office at 563-263-7223.
- For community-partner preschools, please contact the preschool directly (please see "Preschool Programs").

WHAT DOCUMENTATION IS NEEDED TO ENROLL MY CHILD IN PRESCHOOL?

- You must supply the following documents prior to the first day of school:
- » Updated physical (filled out by medical personnel)
- » Updated immunization record
- » Birth certificate or other documentation that shows child's age and date of birth
- » Enrollment form: Each program will have their own enrollment forms to complete



WHAT IF I NEED TRANSPORTATION FOR MY CHILD?

- Limited bussing is available for 4-year-old students.
- You may request bussing if you do not have adequate transportation for your child. Transportation is based on space and need and is not guaranteed.
